

FLYTIPPING

WHAT TO DO IF YOU FIND A FLYTIP

DO NOT

- DO NOT** touch the waste - waste can be dangerous
- DO NOT** open any black bags, boxes or containers
- DO NOT** disturb the site: there may be evidence which could lead to prosecution
- DO NOT** remove anything from the fly-tip site

DO

- DO** remember fly tippers are committing a crime and they do not want to be caught, do not approach them
- DO** visually inspect the waste, try to determine what the waste consists of and how much there is
- DO** take note of its exact location, or the nearest landmark

TYPES OF INFORMATION WE NEED

- Day, date and time of the incident
- Make, model, colour and registration number of vehicle involved
- How much was dumped, eg. black sacks, car boot load, van load
- What was being fly-tipped, eg. household waste, garden rubbish, broken furniture, white goods
- How many people were involved and what they look like
