# Alleluia! Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Continuing our journey through the Church's seasons, we celebrated Easter Day in April and with some lovely baptisms in our local parishes and the lighting of the Paschal Candles, we have been truly reminded of the power of light and life.

On 8th May eighty years ago, Europe, sadly not the whole world, emerged from the darkness of war into the light of hope. All our local villages will be marking VE80. This includes bell ringing in Warnford and East Meon and a special Morning Prayer at Warnford at 9am.

On the Sunday before our parishes will combine and gather in East Meon to give thanks for the cessation of hostilities in Europe with a service based on the one used in Westminster Abbey at several points throughout the day in 1945, starting at 9am and the last being at 9pm. We plan to hold our service in the Vicarage Garden at 1030am, only retreating to the Church if the weather is unkind. Just as people from miles around travelled to London in May 1945, we travel a shorter distance but, like them, with thanksgiving in our hearts.

In April's edition, I wrote about the season of Easter. Despite the popular view that Easter is just a long weekend from Good Friday to Easter Monday, the season of Easter is fifty days long. Those of us brought up on the Book of Common Prayer were accustomed to The Great Forty

Days from Easter Day until Ascension Day (29th May this year), followed by Ascensiontide, leading to Whitsun – more about that in June! Either way, 40 days or 50 days, Easter is not over!

There are a number of significant aspects of the agricultural year that the Church remembers, late in the Easter Season is 'Rogationtide'. The Rogation Days (from the Latin Rogare – to ask) are the three weekdays before Ascension Day. However, in practice, many churches have observed Rogation on the preceding Sunday (the fifth Sunday after Easter in the Prayer Book, the Sixth Sunday of Easter in Common Worship). The Book of Common Prayer Gospel includes the words of Jesus, 'Whatsoever ye shall ask for in my Name, he will give it you', words associated with the heavenly intercession of the ascended Christ.

Originally the Christian observance of Rogation was taken over from Graeco-Roman religion, where an annual procession invoked divine favour to protect crops against mildew. The tradition grew of using processional litanies, often around the parish boundaries, for the blessing of the land. These processions concluded with a mass.

The Rogation procession was suppressed at the Reformation, but it was restored in 1559. The poet George Herbert interpreted the procession as a means of asking for God's blessing on the land, of preserving boundaries, of encouraging fellowship between neighbours with the reconciling of differences and of charitable giving to the poor. The tradition of 'beating the bounds', has been preserved in some communities. In more recent times the scope of Rogation has been widened to include petition for the world of work and for accountable stewardship and prayer for local communities, whether rural or urban. Our parish boundaries are rather extensive, so beating them is beyond many of us, but we shall set off at 3pm on 25th May on a shorter walk from Warnford Church to say prayers out in the fields for the growing crops, for farms and farmers and for all the other rural enterprises around us, returning back to the church for a welcome cuppa. This replaces our morning service at West Meon and all are welcome – dogs too! We return to the beautiful environs of Warnford Church for an outdoor service on Ascension Day (29th March) at 6pm. We shall recall how Jesus left this earth and returned to his Father, ascending into heaven to take his throne over all dominions and powers - trusting in his reign over all creation and submitting to his kingly yet loving rule, hearing the story of his parting, which includes these words of Jesus recorded in the Acts of the Apostles:

"John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now. ... [You] will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses... to the ends of the earth.'

Do come and join us in our celebration.

A Happy and Blessed remainder of the Great Fifty days of Easter to you all! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!



#### Garden Club News

On Thursday 10th April, Nik Knight, Chair of the Hampshire Bat Group and the Hampshire Bat Recorder gave us a fascinating talk on:

"Bats: Superheroes of the Night".

Did you know that bats can eat 3000 insects a night, that they are long-lived (up



to 30 years, with the record held at 40), that they can roost in crevices, holes and even in the bark of trees - when they've not slipped behind a displaced tile on your roof! - and most, but not all, are tiny, weighing no more than a few grammes.

You might think they only fly a few metres away from their roost site but one particularly intrepid traveller, "tagged" before its release from the rescue sanctuary where it had been cared for, visited three countries and crossed the English Channel twice in just one night's flight!

So what can we do to help?

Avoid using pesticides, invest in one or more bat boxes, build a pond to encourage more insects and keep your cat indoors at night.

# The loss of the R101

A hundred years ago many people thought the future of long distance air travel lay not with aeroplanes but with airships – huge aircraft lifted by hydrogen. The British Government embarked on a very expensive programme to build airships which would link the furthest corners of the Empire. The first to be completed made a successful return maiden flight to Canada in 1930, but the second, the R101, attempted a similar flight to India a few weeks later and crashed with the loss of almost everyone on board.

Kit will describe the reasons for what has been called "a terrible, predictable and totally unnecessary catastrophe". The loss of the R101 was a national disaster and dealt a severe blow to Britain's prestige and respect for its technical ability. The incident put a stop to all airship development in Britain, but the airship would have had no place in World War II and perhaps the release of resources was fortuitous.

# Blue Lamp Trust Free Ring doorbells for vulnerable residents

Ageas Insurance have been a long-standing supporter of the Blue Lamp Trust, a charity based in Hampshire which supports vulnerable adults to improve their home safety and security.

The Blue Lamp Trust and Ageas, through its Rias insurance brand, have been working together to supply and install Ring video doorbells in the homes of older or vulnerable customers in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight. So far, the Trust have visited more than 130 Rias customers in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight and, as well as installing the Ring video doorbells, have also carried a free crime and fire prevention survey at the property.

Ageas are now donating a stock of Ring video doorbells to the Trust to be used as a fund to support vulnerable residents in the community who could not otherwise afford to install these units themselves, but that are in clear need of them to improve their home security and give reassurance to them.

Chief Executive Officer Emma Burt said "We are incredibly grateful to Ageas for the support

they have given us over recent years, and having this supply of Ring video doorbells that we can fit at our discretion for those most in need within our community is a real help. We often receive requests that we cannot fulfil due to the cost implications, so it will be wonderful to be able to say yes to those who really need our assistance."

Ring video doorbells can be a great deterrent but can also be used to gain evidence in cases of domestic abuse or anti-social behaviour.

# The vanishing call of Britain's lapwing

Spring in the British countryside once echoed with the distinctive, trilling call of the northern lapwing (Vanellus Vanellus), a striking black-and-white bird with a shimmering green back and a wispy crest. Also known as the peewit - after its haunting call - lapwings were once a common sight but today, their numbers are in serious decline.

Lapwings are an unmistakable part of the UK's natural heritage. Their dramatic, tumbling flight displays in early spring are a spectacle, as males perform acrobatic dives to impress potential mates. But while they may be bold in the air, they are incredibly vulnerable on the ground.

As ground-nesting birds, lapwings lay their well-camouflaged eggs in simple scrapes in mud or sand, on short grassland and arable land. This makes them highly susceptible to disturbance from people, livestock, and,



crucially, off-lead dogs. A single frightened bird taking flight may not seem particularly noticeable, but if lapwings are repeatedly disturbed, they abandon their nests - leaving eggs or chicks exposed to predators and the elements.

Habitat loss has already pushed lapwing numbers into steep decline. Since 1967, the UK population has decreased by 55 per cent, earning them Red List status as a species of conservation concern. Loss of mixed farming, spring coppicing and the intensification of grassland management have all contributed to their struggles.

Many nature reserves managed by Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust provide nesting areas for various species of ground nesting birds, including Testwood Lakes Nature Reserve, near Southampton, which is home to breeding lapwings.

As a nation of dog lovers, we all want to enjoy the great outdoors with our furry companions. But we must also remember that we share these spaces with wildlife that depends on them for survival.

One of the biggest challenges is how difficult these nests can be to spot, even for trained eyes, in open locations where you would expect to see them. Their natural camouflage makes them blend seamlessly into their surroundings, increasing the risk of accidental disturbance.

By keeping dogs close by and under control during the ground-nesting bird season, which lasts from now until late summer, we can help protect vulnerable birds and other species. Small changes in our behaviour can make a big difference, ensuring that future generations can continue to enjoy the sights and sounds of nature in our beautiful landscapes.



**I'm worried about my debt and rising bills**, and I want to know what support is available. Do you have any advice on managing rising costs and what to do if you fall into debt?

With energy, water and broadband bills on the rise, it's getting increasingly difficult for many people to cover their expenses. It's important to know you're not alone and that financial support might be available to help ease the burden.

#### Checking benefits eligibility

A significant number of eligible people don't claim the benefits that are available to them, so it's important to understand what you're entitled to. You may be able to claim benefits if, for example, you're at working age and on a low income, you're sick or disabled, are of State Pension age with a low income or no income, or if you're a carer. The Citizens Advice website (www.citizensadvice.org.uk) has lots of useful information about benefits.

#### Reducing outgoings

If you claim benefits or are on a low income, you may be eligible for a reduction in Council Tax. Discounts can also be given to students, those living with a carer, or people who live alone. If you have children and claim certain benefits, or are on a low income, you may qualify for free school meals, transport to school, or support with the cost of uniform. To reduce other expenses, you may be able to switch to a cheaper broadband deal, get a water meter fitted, or access discounted travel options.

#### Creating a budget and prioritising bills

If you're finding it difficult to stay on top of bills, budgeting tools like the one on the MoneyHelper website (www.moneyhelper.org.uk) can be very useful in helping you understand what money you have coming in and going out each month. If you're behind on bills, you should prioritise paying rent, mortgage payments, Council Tax and energy bills, as these are known as 'priority' debts which have the most serious consequences if missed.

Once you've got priority debts under control, you should look at credit card or store card debts, missed Buy Now Pay Later payments or payday loans. Whatever debt you're dealing with, it's important to speak to the person or company you owe money to as early as you can.
